

BRIGHTON LE SANDS

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Location:

This beach is often named as Brighton beach. On the western shore of Botany Bay is the location. Brighton-Le-Sands is a suburb in the southern Sydney. The beach is located 13km south-west of the city, it is also a local government area of Bayside Council and St George area. As you walk along you could either reach Lady Robinsons beach or Cook Park. At Brighton-Le-Sands there are a mixture of many landmarks such as beaches, parks, fields, churches, primary schools and even libraries.

History:

Have you ever wondered about the history of Brighton-Le-Sands? Its history started in the late eighteenth century on 31 January 1971. This particular history is mostly focusing on the time between the European settlements to the 1970s. The region between the Cooks River and Georges River was formerly recognized as Seven Mile Beach. But now it is known as the Lady Robinsons Beach started from 1874. By 1900s on the grounds was a pony race track/course just south of Bay Street. This development began before World War One.
