When the new Bayside Council was proclaimed on 9 September 2016, we were given just 12 months to bring about the merging of the two former Council organisations prior to the next general election of councillors.

As Administrator for that period, and in company with the management

team of the new Council, we have dedicated ourselves to harmonising policies and practices, building staff cohesion and ensuring that your services and infrastructure continue without disruption.

I'm pleased to report that, some two months into the task, we are making great progress. Already we have identified millions of dollars in potential savings and many opportunities to make improvements and enhancements to services and facilities over time. There are many challenges to be met and overcome too, of course. However, I am confident that we can deliver better outcomes for our community.

One of the immediate benefits to come from the merger of the two Councils is the Stronger Communities Fund.

I am delighted to announce the availability of \$10 million for community projects:

- \$1 million for a community grant program, in grants of up to \$50,000 to incorporated not-for-profit community groups for projects that build more vibrant, sustainable local communities; and
- \$9 million for projects of larger scale priority infrastructure and services that deliver long-term economic and social benefit.

Make sure that you look out for the opening of applications for these funding opportunities. Together we can capitalise on this opportunity for major improvements to our community.

Minister Visits

The Minister for Local Government The Honourable Paul Toole spent the morning at Bayside Council on Monday 14 November to see the progress since amalgamation.

The Minister met Administrator Greg Wright and General Manager Meredith Wallace.

"The Administrator Greg Wright, Interim General Manager Meredith Wallace and staff have all done an incredible job since the new council was created. The creation of Bayside Council is a fresh start for residents and ratepayers," Mr Toole said.

The NSW Government has given Bayside Council \$10 million through the Stronger Communities Fund, for local community and infrastructure projects. \$1 million will go towards community groups, with grants of up to \$50,000.

"These grants have seen community groups in other new councils upgrade facilities and I encourage all interested groups to attend one of Bayside Council's sessions and find out how they can apply."

The Minister also visited the new Rockdale Library and took time to meet and thank Council staff for their work.

Bill Batley's extraordinary community service was acknowledged at a Council Meeting on Wednesday 9 November.

Bill was actively interested in the foreshore area of Botany Bay and Cook Park. He was also President of the Ramsgate Life Saving Club and was Citizen of the Year in 1999. In 2000 he carried the Olympic Torch for the Bexley leg of the Olympic Torch Relay.

Council held a community fun day on Saturday 8 October for the completion of a large mural celebrating the life of local author Patricia Carlon. The mural acknowledges her writing, the fact that she was profoundly deaf and her love of cats.

Patricia Carlon (1927-2002) was a Bexley local and an internationally renowned crime thriller author who had 14 novels published between 1961 and 1970. Her books can be found in Council's libraries.

COUNCIL PROJECTS

New Cycleway Strategy

Council is preparing a new cycling strategy to improve current infrastructure and facilities to encourage more residents to take up cycling.

All Bayside cycleways have been inspected by Council officers as a first step to map out the current environment.

Cook Park Amenities

Council is upgrading Cook Park public amenities to provide the community with high quality facilities accessible to everyone. The proposed building will include a new accessible unisex toilet, baby change and four new unisex toilets.

Construction will be completed in autumn 2017. Access to affected areas will be restricted with temporary fencing during construction periods.



Brighton Le Sands Boardwalk Upgrade

The original decking is being replaced and will be done in short sections to minimise interruptions. The timber block seats will be refurbished and lights will be replaced.

Work is scheduled to start late November and is expected to finish mid-December.

Council together with the St George Domestic Violence Committee is helping raise awareness of domestic violence by encouraging people to talk about this serious issue.

Over 25,000 disposable coffee cups with an anti-violence message have been distributed to cafés in the area for use from Friday 25 November – Saturday 10 December. This coincides with the global 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence campaign.

Support the many cafés taking part in the scheme and raise awareness about domestic violence.

The St George Domestic Violence Committee, comprising the Police, NSW Health, local councils, charities and churches across the St George area, meets monthly to consider local domestic violence issues.



Pool Update

The Angelo Anestis Aquatic Centre in Bexley is on schedule and if everything goes to plan and the fine weather continues it is expected to open before Australia Day 2017.



Dog Park Upgrade

Council is installing irrigation systems at Sparks Street Reserve leash free dog park (Mascot) and at Hayden Place leash free dog park within Sir Joseph Banks Park, Botany. Work will start on 30 November and take about two weeks (weather permitting).





Linear Park, Mascot

A new park is coming to Mascot. Linear Park will become the largest area of public open space within the Mascot Station Town Centre Precinct and will provide valuable green space to the growing residential and working population of Mascot.



Rhodes Reserve

Rhodes Reserve West in Hillsdale was funded and built by developer contributions. Works are now complete with new paths and landscaping.



Lever St Reserve

Lever Street Reserve in Mascot opened in September. Includes new playground equipment, furniture and landscaping.

Stronger Communities Fund

As part of the recent amalgamation of the former City of Botany Bay and Rockdale City Councils the State Government has provided Bayside Council with \$10 million under the Stronger Communities Fund to kick start the delivery of priority infrastructure and services for the local community. Of this, \$1 million has been allocated towards a community grants program whilst \$9 million has been allocated towards a Major Projects Program.

Local community groups will be able to apply for community grants of between \$5,000 and \$50,000. Grants of less than \$5,000 will also be made available through Council's Community Grants program.

Community groups which are eligible and interested in applying for a grant will be able to attend information sessions in December. Applications will open in December and close at the end of February 2017.
