Banksmeadow Public School won the group category in the annual Pauline McLeod Awards.

The Pauline McLeod Awards are hosted annually by the Eastern Region Local Government Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Forum (ERLGATSIF) in partnership with the Councils of Bayside, City of Sydney, Inner West, Randwick, Waverley and Woollahra.

The Pauline McLeod Awards celebrate the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities across all six Councils and promote reconciliation across the region.

The Awards are named after the late Pauline McLeod, an icon in Australian media and entertainment who worked across many platforms to teach and celebrate her First Nation heritage.

In recent years, the Awards have fallen on National Sorry Day, a time to remember those from the Stolen Generations, including Pauline McLeod and her siblings.
