All 800 tickets to the event were snatched up within 48 hours of being advertised in the local paper.

"The largest available demountable Circus Marquee has a sit-down capacity for 800 people. We now have a waiting list and will do our best to accommodate as many as possible. Council staff work hard on this free to ensure everyone has a fun time," a council spokesman said.

This event which started with about 300 guests in Mascot Memorial Park later moved to Sir Joseph Banks to cater for the increased interest from seniors. This popular event remains a highlight on council's event calendar.
