Sir Joseph Banks Park benefits from World Environment Day

Sir Joseph Banks Park in Botany has thousands more native trees and shrubs thanks to a community tree planting challenge completed for World Environment Day on Tuesday 5 June.

The 28-hectare park is an important natural habitat for native flora and fauna species and is a significant open space for the local community to enjoy. Over one hundred volunteers from Sydney's corporate community joined forces with Bayside Council, Greater Sydney Local Land Services and Conservation Volunteers Australia for the day that saw company teams from AMP, Aon, Fuji Xerox, ING Bank, NIB, Origin, Tibra and Ventia Boral Amey Joint Venture competing against each other to plant as many native plants as possible in a two-hour period.

During the event over 3000 native trees and shrubs were planted in bushland areas of the park to increase native species diversity, provide habitat for native animals and supress weeds.

The contribution from corporate sector volunteers at this event has helped Council's environmental restoration and Bushcare volunteer programs in the park.
