Speeding — Stop it or Cop it

Speeding? Stop It or Cop - that's the message from Bayside Council and the NSW Police.

"Too many people continue to be seriously injured or killed on roads as a result of speeding," said Mayor Bill Saravinovski.

"I am pleased Bayside Council is supporting this campaign to reduce death and serious injuries on our roads. When it comes to speeding, the message is simple, *Stop It or Cop It.*"

Bus shelters will be used to reinforce the message, in conjunction with variable message signs at targeted locations; local media; social media and Council's website. Every driver needs to take responsibility for the speed at which they drive, and driver to the conditions.

The campaign, which runs for two weeks from Monday 17 September, is part of Council's Road Safety Action Plan, funded by a Transport for NSW Roads & Maritime Services grant.
