Bayside Council Supplies Mascot Towers Documents

Bayside Mayor Bill Saravinovski has strongly denied allegations Council is withholding any documents relating to Mascot Towers.

“Council is making every effort to ensure all necessary documents relating to Mascot Towers are available. We are talking about records going back to 2004. These records need to be recovered from offsite archive facilities,” Mayor Bill Saravinovski said.

“We have been there, helping and assisting, from day one. Our concern is for the residents. If it would speed things up I will drive to the Hunter Storage Facility and pick up the files myself.”

All relevant information that is currently stored electronically has been supplied to the parties who have requested it, this includes some information on 1-5 Bourke Street and all information for 27 Church Avenue (the adjoining site).

The Structural Plans, Geo Technical report and Hydraulic Report for 27 Church Avenue (adjoining site) have been supplied.

The dilapidation report for 1-5 Bourke dated October 2017 commissioned by the developers of 27 Church Avenue prior to construction commencing has been supplied.

More detailed Structural Plans, Geo Technical report and Hydraulic Report for 1-5 Bourke Street are stored off site in hardcopy.

The retrieval of this documentation has been challenging due to the age of the documents and the hardcopy format.

This information is being made available to parties who have requested it as soon as it becomes available.
