The Bayside Business Awards are on again. I hope all businesses large and small get behind these Bayside Business Awards that recognise the positive contribution local business makes to our community.

COUNCILLORS CONDEMN CLEARWAY

Many residents and business owners attended an extraordinary council meeting held on Wednesday 31 July to hear Council condemn the State Government's proposal to extend clearways on Forest Road and Stone Creek Road, Bexley.

Bayside Councillors unanimously condemned the proposal and instructed Council to write to the Minister for Transport and Roads urging him to find a solution that will not destroy local businesses and the quality of life for residents.



"The RMS have done no consultation or proper planning. They have simply decided to whack in some clearways to improve the traffic flow with no thought about the impact on local businesses who contribute to the local economy nor the residents who live along these roads," Mayor Saravinovski said.

Bexley Depot Sets New Standard



Bexley Depot has been resurfaced with Reconophalt a new asphalt product that incorporates recycled materials like soft plastics, glass, toner from used cartridges and reclaimed asphalt in the mix.

The work at Bexley Depot involved laying nearly 400 tonnes of new asphalt containing recycled material equivalent to 314,558 plastic bags, 25,882 glass bottles and 7,142 toner cartridges.

The resurfacing has also improved access to Council's newly constructed Community Recycling Drop Off Event shed, where Bayside residents can drop off material such as mattresses, car tyres, metals, white goods, e-waste, green waste, toner cartridges, large flattened cardboard, clothing, gas bottles and x-ray film.

The next recycling drop off:

Bexley Depot: Saturday 7 September and 5 October. **Botany Depot:** Saturday 17 August and 21 September.

New Dog Poo Recycling Bins



Bayside Council is trialling Dog Poo Recycling Bins at off-leash dog parks and reserves for the community to responsibly discard dog poo.

The bio-degradable bags available on-site and dog poo will be combined with food waste from Council buildings to produce good quality soil, with the assistance of thousands of compost worms.

BODY CAMS FOR RANGERS

Council Rangers have been fitted out with new body camera hi-vis vests to reduce safety concerns as well as the opportunity to identify risks.

"The body cameras are visible and people will be aware they are being recorded" Mayor Saravinovski said. "Hopefully it will reduce the abuse our Rangers get for doing their job, particularly over the summer months along the foreshore area. Council will also have a record of interactions should a complaint be lodged against a Council Ranger. It will work both ways," he said.

As part of the Summer Foreshore Improvement Program Council will, for the first time, engage the services of local Police Officers to work with the Rangers to combat anti-social behaviour.

"The Police have greater enforcement powers" Mayor Saravinovski said "which will hopefully make those responsible think twice before acting."



NBN Construction

COUNCIL'S PROJECTS



Rowland Park

Bayside Council is providing improved recreational facilities for the community. Works include construction of a new amenities building, a new playground and other recreational facilities within the park:

- New amenities building with new public toilets, external hand wash and drinking fountain;
- New sporting facilities with storage and change rooms;
- Internal upgrade to the canteen;
- New playground equipment for mixed age groups;
- Nature play spaces including sensory and musical elements and a sandpit;
- Shade sails and natural shade;
- Seats, bike racks, picnic tables and picnic shelters;
- Fencing on road frontages;
- Landscaping and tree planting;
- Outdoor ping pong table and basketball practice area.

Hillsdale Childcare Centre

The outdoor play area at Hilldale Childcare Centre has been upgraded with exciting, functional play spaces for the children.

The Centre caters for children aged 6 weeks to 5 years old and is committed to providing quality educational programs with an emphasis on play-based learning.

Mutch Park Skate Park

The Skate Park will provide improved recreational facilities for the community and includes:

- Construction of a plaza style concrete skate park including elements such as flatbanks, ledges, stairs & hubba, quarterpipe and waterfall;
- Associated park furniture such as seating, a drinking fountain and shade shelter;
- Landscaping and tree planting;
- Improved access road off Wentworth Avenue to the car parking areas;
- Lighting to assist passive surveillance (not for night use of the skate park).

Wilsons Cottage

The works, conservation of the State Listed Heritage items, has been completed. They have included:

- Stabilisation of the stone walls and chimney;
- Repairs to timber roof structure and new roof sheeting;
- Replacement of timber verandah;
- Reinstatement of border stone and sandstone flagging;
- Construction of new concrete floor (the original was dirt);
- Replacement of doors and windows to replicate the original fabric;
- Connection of power to the building to install lights (there was no power previously).



Mayor's Message



It gives me great pleasure to present the 2019-2020 budget for Bayside Council. Council has prepared a financially responsible, balanced budget which exceeds \$200 million.

This budget meets the demands of our City by maintaining and improving services for our community.

We continue to deliver on major projects in our parks, amenities, sports fields and transport network.

This budget ensures our residents live in well planned and well serviced suburbs.

We provide our community with a safe, clean environment and we are focussed on making it safer for all to enjoy with programs such as the summer foreshore program. We are responsible for more than \$1.7 billion in community assets.

Our budget ensures we are protecting and maintaining those assets so the community is able to benefit from them.

Your rates are an investment in your community and a large portion of our budget is funded by rates. However with strong financial discipline, we have been able to ensure rates are only increased by the State Government approved limit of 2.7 percent.

This is a major achievement in an environment where everyday costs for providing services are increasing at a much higher rate than our revenue. Keeping increases to the minimum is a challenge when costs are continually on the rise, but it is something we have been able to achieve as a result of fiscal discipline, adopting best practice, and supporting innovation and forward thinking.

Bayside is a growing and thriving community and this budget will take our community forward and continue to build on what has already been achieved.

The 2019-2020 budget outlined in this document for the next financial year provides stability and sustainability for everyone.



POPULATION BREAK DOWN (2016)*





Minimum rate increase for 2019-2020


Through careful financial management rate increases across the LGA have been kept to the 2.7 percent determined under the State Government's Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART).

In accordance with the amalgamation legislation the rate structure for both former Councils remains the same as it was prior to becoming Bayside and will do so until the 1 July 2021.
