The Bayside foreshore is a popular destination for visitors and a suburban oasis for locals.

Council's 'Summer at the Foreshore' program has been developed to help reduce our environmental footprint, preserve our beautiful beaches and marine life while maintaining a safe space for residents and visitors to enjoy.

Bayside Mayor Joe Awada said Council is also keeping the foreshore clean during summer by providing additional bins and waste services.

"Botany Bay is a beautiful part of the Sydney coast and a popular summer destination. The foreshore is something we can all enjoy whether it's an evening stroll, visiting a restaurant or taking a selfie with our newest residents, the Crab and Hippo," Mayor Joe Awada said.

"I urge residents and visitors to dispose of their rubbish in one of the many bins provided or take it with them."



The 'Breath Easy' smoke free trial zone extends from the Little Grand Parade to the Brighton Kiosk and stretches from the Grand Parade to the water. Visitors and residents will notice new signs indicating the Breathe Easy trial zone.

Council rangers, with the help of additional police patrols, will be also roam the foreshore encouraging visitors to act responsibly.

Council is also providing extra bins and litter collection services. New bin sensors alert Council to which bins are ready for collections.

# **Ramsgate SLSC Celebrates**



The Ramsgate Surf Life Saving Club will celebrate 85 years of service to the community on Sunday 15 December with various activities including an official march past of former members.

The Club, which provides waterbased skills training for local children between the ages of 3 to 14 years, started in the "Barn" on Ramsgate Beach in 1934. In 1959 it moved into the community funded building it now occupies.

In 2018 the lack of sand at Ramsgate Beach saw the Club move all activities to Monterey Baths.

The Club is looking forward to returning to Ramsgate Beach this season following the success of the beach nourishment program being carried out by Council.

The Club has 256 registered nippers, and 460 affiliated members.

# COUNCIL'S PROJECTS

#### **Arncliffe Park**

The existing soccer field is being replaced with a new all-weather synthetic playing surface. The project includes new and improved stormwater drainage and new footpaths around the perimeter fence.

#### **Charles Daly Reserve**

The play space has been completely renovated and expanded to include a new circuit path, seating, a diverse range of play equipment with shade sails over the main equipment, and planting.

Equipment includes climbing structures, swings, slides, and spinning elements catering for a range of ages and abilities.

# Maintenance and Upgrades

City Works crews have upgraded traffic facilities on Charles Street, Arncliffe.

The work involved the extension of the median island, removal of concrete speed humps and re-sheeting the pavement with asphalt.







#### **Rockdale Park**

The Rockdale Park upgrade includes improved public amenities and a new water feature consisting of shallow reflection ponds and water gardens, running water, sitting edges and a bridge crossing.

#### **Beach Rejuvenation**

Council's bold plan to rejuvenate Ramsgate Baths is expected to provide long lasting benefits well into the future. Machinery installed at Sandringham Bay is pumping sand along the Cook Park foreshore via a temporary pipeline where it will be used to repair the beach profile at Ramsgate baths.

Sections of the beach will be closed during the process which is expected to be completed before Christmas.







#### Kingsgrove Avenue Reserve

The upgrade provides better access from Kingsgrove Avenue, a new play structure and swings, nature play and enhanced seating areas for spectators and carers.

Visitors enjoyed lots of free activities including face painting, amusement rides a petting zoo, camel rides and live performances.


