I am pleased to report that our *Butt out of Bayside* campaign has forced Georges River Council to rethink their ludicrous proposal to carve off a portion of Bayside and move it into their Local Government Area.

The area under attack included part of our foreshore together with Monterey, Sans Souci, Ramsgate, Ramsgate Beach and Dolls Point. Council put forward a very detailed and compelling submission against the take-over bid, as did many of our residents.

I am delighted, and relieved, that Georges River have come to their senses. We can now all get on and do the job we were elected to do, looking after our own residents and ratepayers.

With COVID-19 restrictions easing, ANZAC Day Services across Bayside will be held, providing a solemn opportunity for residents to pay their respects to those who made the ultimate sacrifice.

However, it you attend a service please remember that COVID-19 restrictions although eased, are still in place, including complying with the 1.5 metre physical distancing rule and everyone must register or sign in.

We have included a full list of services for your convenience. I suggest that if you are thinking of attending a service please check with the appropriate RSL Sub-Branch as capacity may be limited depending on the venue.

Council's *No Hooning Campaign* calling for the State Government to install speed cameras on Bay Street in Brighton Le Sands is gaining momentum. We are also investigating a number of additional measures to protect the safety of our residents.

OUR ANZAC FLAGS

When Australia went to war on 4 August 1914, more than 2,000 men from the Bayside Local Government Area answered the call of King and Country and enlisted. Aboriginal men also served, while nurses contributed to the war effort at home and overseas.

This year the ANZAC flags flying across Bayside are a tribute to all our heroes. Our ANZAC flags feature the images of six local heroes. Here are their stories.



Douglas Grant (1885-1951)

Douglas Grant, a Ngadjonji man from the upland rainforest country in the Atherton Tablelands was a mechanical draughtsman and wool classer.

Australia's only known Aboriginal World War I prisoner of War, Grant was captured during the First Battle of Bullecourt in 1917.

During his incarceration he became president of the British Help Committee (The Red Cross) and organised food parcels and medical supplies.

George Oscar Seaforth Nilson (1892-1940)

Carpenter George Nilson was the son of Alderman and Mayor Oscar Nilson of Botany.

He served with the 9th Light Trench Mortar Battery in Belgium, firing three inch Stokes ammunition at enemy targets.

Hospitalised with pleurisy and gas poisoning during the war he never regained full health.

Jack Emanuel (1893-1952)

Jack Emanuel was a bookmaker's clerk living in Railway Street, Rockdale, when he enlisted in May 1915 at the age of 21.

He served at Gallipoli and then on the Western Front.

Jack was an outstanding soldier and was twice decorated with the Military Medal.

John David Wright (1895-1955)

John Wright was a Botany fellmonger who served in France with the 3rd Battalion.

He was wounded in action at the Battle of Menin Road on 22 September 1917.

Later he took part in the Spring Offensives of March and April 1918 and the Second Battle of Albert.

His older brother, Herbert (SERN: 4302) was killed in action in France during March 1917, just four days after he arrived on the front line.

Phyllis Mary Boissier (1884-1976)

Matron Phyllis Boissier of Botany embarked on the hospital ship *Kyarra* in 1914.

In Egypt she treated the wounded from Gallipoli, receiving the Royal Red Cross (2nd Class) Medal from King George V in 1916.

She also served in France during the Battles of the Somme.

After the war she was appointed Matron of Royal Prince Alfred Hospital. She was the first female Justice of the Peace in NSW.

Thomas Burtt (1893-1918)

Botany boy Thomas Burtt was working in Queensland as a shearer and cook when he enlisted in mid-1915.

He lost several toes to frostbite suffered at Gallipoli. Invalided home, he soon joined up again.

Tom was killed in action near Villers-Bretonneux on 3 April 1918, leaving two war diaries for his fiancée in London.

Older brothers James Burtt and Harry Burtt also served.

Security Upgrade

Council has stepped up security at the Bayside Garden Centre with cameras and more security fencing.

"The Centre, a joint a venture between Council and the Intellectual Disability Foundation of St George, provides meaningful employment for people with a disability. All profits are reinvested into the Centre which has over 800 different plant species available. The Centre is open to the public and is well worth a visit," Mayor Joe Awada said.

SMALL RENOVATION FEES WAIVED

Council voted to waive any Council fees incurred for small renovations or alteration works under \$100,000 to help support the local economic recovery in the wake of COVID-19.

Council previously voted to waive the fees associated with lodgement of Development Applications for alterations and additions for Class 1 (single dwellings) and Class 10 (sheds and carports) buildings.

"It is important we continue to support ratepayers where possible, especially when it also helps boost the local economic recovery for building and construction and associated trades," Mayor Joe Awada said.



Bayside Council scheduled an Extraordinary Council Meeting on Wednesday 3 February to endorse its official response to the State Government's draft changes to rates legislation.

"Council has always advocated for a gradual rates harmonisation process that supports all residents during this change. We are all one Bayside and our submission will ensure a fair and balanced approach," Mayor Joe Awada said.

Council's submission endorses rate harmonisation over a minimum four year transition period for both residents and businesses. IPART undertook a review of the local government rating system in 2019 and made a number of recommendations to the NSW Office of Local Government.

These recommendations have been under review and in November 2020 all NSW Councils were asked to provide feedback on draft changes relating to the rating system by Friday 5 February.

Council's submission supports a staged rates harmonisation process over a minimum four-year transition period for both residents and businesses.

This is for both the minimum rate change as well as the ad valorem amounts. Council does not support different residential rates in our urban areas as this could lead to the creation of different communities of interest within one local government area and perceptions of inequity in the way rates are levied and services are delivered.





The Hon John Ajaka MLC

Mayor Joe Awada caught up with The Hon John Ajaka MLC on Friday 26 February to wish him well as he prepares to retire from politics in April.

The Hon John Ajaka MLC is currently serving as the 21st President of the Upper House in the NSW Parliament. He began both his legal and political career in Rockdale.

Prior to joining the State Parliament of NSW he had a legal practice in Rockdale and served as a Councillor on the former Rockdale City Council from 2004 to 2008.

Mayor Awada presented The Hon John Ajaka MLC with a copy of a Mayoral Minute which recognised his outstanding contribution to the community and NSW.

CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY

Over 200 Bayside volunteers collected 100 bags of general litter (estimated at 2 tonnes) and 40 bags of recycling (estimated at 100kg) on Clean Up Australia Day on Sunday 7 March 2021. Bayside Mayor Joe Awada also was on hand to help staff prepare for Clean Up Australia Day on Friday afternoon.



"I want to thank all Bayside volunteers for taking part in what has become Australia's largest community-based event," Mayor Joe Awada said. "Australia faces many waste challenges, but together we can make a difference."

COUNCIL'S PROJECTS

This is just a small snapshot of some of the projects Council has been working on in the area



Autumn Planting

Council has started its annual Autumn Remediation and Planting Program in local parks and reserves. Planning begins in the summer when key areas are identified for renewal and improvement.

Mascot Memorial Park is one of the key areas identified for extensive renewal as the hedging, which is about 20 years old, is suffering from boxwood blight. There will be bare patches in the rows of manicured hedges until the young plants grow.

New Roundabout

This included a new roundabout being built at the intersection of Clareville and Sanoni Avenues. Designed to assist in filtering and slowing traffic through this intersection the roundabout will also be landscaped to help improve the aesthetic.





Botany Golf Club

Council replaced some turf at the Botany Golf Course with Windsor Green Couch. Its deeper root system is better suited to the sandy soil profile of the course.

L'Estrange Park

New sporting facilities are also being constructed in L'Estrange Park to support the clubs that use these grounds. This includes: change rooms, a kiosk, club storage and public amenities.





Anglicare Boarding House Mural

Council worked with the developer of new boarding house on Botany Road which will be run by Anglicare to ensure the site incorporates a mural painted by a local artist.

The history of the site as a former Commonwealth Bank building is also reflected in photographs in the lift areas.



Colson Crescent Reserve

Council is also upgrading the playground at Colson Crescent with new play equipment and an imaginative play area. New shade trees and plants will complement the natural space.



Cahill Park Café

The café is part of a multi-million dollar upgrade to Cahill Park that includes an amenities block, a new seawall, pathways and an off-leash dog area. Rasha Enterprises won the tender to operate the new café in Cahill Park. Council received 13 submissions that underwent a comprehensive evaluation assessment by the Tender Evaluation Panel.

"The tender process was extremely competitive so it was an added bonus that a local Bayside business was the one selected. Cahill Park is a major recreational space and it is great news that a café will soon be opening for locals and visitors to enjoy," Mayor Joe Awada said.



Road Community Infrastructure Funding

Council has applied for \$5.18M in grant funding under the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) Phase 2.

The Federal Government has allocated funding for local councils across the country and Bayside Council is eligible to receive up to \$5.18 million to help deliver projects that benefit the community through improved road safety, accessibility and visual amenity. "To claim the grant money Council must put forward projects that meet the criteria which includes Council's ability to complete the project by the end of the year," Mayor Joe Awada said.

"This \$5.18 million would be a great boost to the community. Investing in doing some much needed maintenance on traffic islands and traffic management systems will improve visual amenity as well as boosting the local economy impacted by the global pandemic." Other projects included:

Botany Town Hall Upgrade

"I am very impressed with the improvements to the Botany Town Hall and I am looking forward to seeing this heritage building being returned to community use," Bayside Mayor Joe Awada said.

Council has replaced the roof and guttering. A new internal lift, new accessibility ramp and accessible toilets means the building complies with current standards and will be able to be enjoyed by the wider community.

Carpentry work is still being done on the upstairs stage before the floor is sanded and stained. Landscaping the outside gardens will start soon.

Bayside Council endorsed a library fine amnesty and agreed to abolish future fines on overdue library items at a Council Meeting on Wednesday 10 March.

"This is a great initiative that is being adopted by many libraries," Mayor Joe Awada said.
