

Using Dog Off-Leash Areas

Under the NSW Companion Animals Act there are strict rules governing the control and behaviour of dogs and dog owners in public. Failure to comply with this act could result receiving a fine. Our off-leash areas are regularly patrolled and on the spot penalties apply for non-compliance. We recommend checking the Bayside Council website to ensure you have the most up to date information, as changes can occur.

Off Leash Dog Area!!

Taking your pet outdoors to a dog-friendly space is important, regular off-leash exercise helps dogs relieve boredom and let off steam. It may also reduce unwanted behaviour such as excessive barking. Outdoor exercise also benefits owners as dog-friendly spaces brings people together. That's why Bayside Council has created the off-leash area at Lady Robinson's Beach, Kyeemagh.

Remember to Follow These Simple Rules:

Off-leash exercise areas are shared areas for the enjoyment of all. Rules have been put in place to ensure a safe and enjoyable time for you, your best friend and our community:

- Dogs must be kept under control at all times, handlers must be physically able to control or restrain the dog if required by chain, cord or leash.
- Dogs must be supervised at all times and in sight of their owner/handler.
- Your dog should not harass people or other animals. Even when dogs are in off-leash areas, they must still be under effective voice control.
- If any dog/s show signs of aggression or anti-social behaviour the dog's handler must leash and remove their dog immediately.
- You must clean up after your dog/s at all times.
- Dogs are to be on leash when entering or exiting the designated off leash beach area (Gate 60 and Gate 61)

Please Consider Others

Off-leash areas are still public areas, which means they are open for all to enjoy, not just dog owners. Not all people like dogs and some people can be intimidated by even small dogs running up to them, so never let your dog jump up on people.

If your dog does not return to you when called or you have difficulty controlling your dog's behaviour, you should never let your dog off its leash. Remember significant fines can apply to owners found doing the wrong thing.
