Dr Curry is Bayside's first female Mayor.



Rachael set up *Pantry4thePeople* in Botany to provide anyone suffering from financial stress access to food staples during the COVID-19 pandemic. *Pantry4thePeople,* open 24/7, is stocked with food staples donated by individuals and businesses.

This simple idea has made a huge difference and Rachel is an inspiration to anyone wanting to help others in need.

Ammrutha Vashetharan was named Bayside Sportsperson of the Year. Ammrutha started competitive archery in June 2017 and has won many Gold and Silver medals throughout her short sporting career.

She is currently preparing for the 2022 Asia Cup and World Archery Championships.

COUNCIL'S PROJECTS

This is just a small snapshot of some of the projects Council has been working on in the area.

Sir Joseph Banks Park

A major upgrade to the playspace at Sir Joseph Banks Park is due to start later this year.

Designs for the new playspace are based on extensive community engagement with approximately 1000 people reviewing earlier concept designs, sharing ideas or completing an online survey.

Lighting Up Bayside

Ador Adventure Park Playground

The former Rockdale Bowling Club site has been transformed into a recreational hub for all ages as part of the NSW State Government's M6 Stage 1 Project.

Fully funded by the Government it includes an adventure playground, state-of-the-art skate park, sporting fields, bike tracks, animal sculptures, BBQs and picnic areas.

"The Councillors and I are pleased that the upgrade was completed, and opened, before the kids went back to school. It's a fabulous facility and a great day out for all our Bayside families," Mayor Dr Christina Curry said.

"We look forward to showcasing the transformation when we officially rename the park in the new year."

The park will named in keeping with Council's policy to recognise our First Nations people.

'World First' Smart Camera Trial Extended



Bayside Council's recent trial of sophisticated high-tech cameras incorporating licence plate recognition technology has been expanded to include Bay Street, Brighton Le Sands and the surrounding area.

"Recent trials were a success and Council believes this technology can help combat hooning and bring the culprits destroying the reputation of Bayside to account," Mayor Dr Christina Curry said.

Council is working with its suppliers to look at further possible use of this technology including monitoring jet skis coming too close to swimmers in the bay.

The new technology has also been given the tick of approval by the Parking Officers and Council has seen a significant reduction in the number of incident reports and community complaints.

This technology is recognised as a 'world first' and Bayside Council is at the forefront for using technology to combat anti-social behaviour.

Scarborough Park Pathway Closed

The Scarborough Park pathway is closed and temporary fencing installed to allow workers to safely remove some vegetation in preparation for the construction of a new shared cycle and pedestrian pathway.

Transport for NSW is undertaking the works as part of the M6 Stage 1 Project. Vegetation will be removed in preparation for construction of a shared bicycle and pedestrian pathway to expand the existing active transport network and improve pedestrian and cyclist safety.

The entrances to Scarborough Park at the intersection of O'Connell Street, Chuter Avenue and Robinson Street, and the intersection of Civic Avenue near Annette Avenue will be temporarily closed.

UPGRADE FOR ADOR AVE PCYC



Bayside Council has signed a five-year lease agreement with PCYC NSW that is set to breathe new life into the PCYC building and facilities at 9 Ador Avenue, Rockdale.

"Council is committed to supporting PCYC NSW and the important youth activities and services they deliver to our community," Mayor Dr Christina Curry said.

Council has offered a 95% rental subsidy and the PCYC has agreed to undertake essential repairs on the 50-year-old building.

The PCYC will continue to operate while the upgrade takes place. The initial lease is for five years after which a long-term lease will be negotiated.

Local History

Leonie Bell won the 2021 Ron Rathbone Local History Competition.

Leonie's entry, Dappeto, is an engaging story of Dappeto House, its owner and builder Frederick Gibbins, and the girls who lived there when it was a Salvation Army home for girls.

This annual competition honours the memory of Ron Rathbone OAM, a Councillor and former Mayor of the City of Rockdale who was also the author of several local history books.
